

The 2000s A Decade In Review



2000 Election

- Democrats nominate Vice President Al Gore
- Republicans choose Texas governor George W. Bush
- Green Party choose Ralph Nader
 - promote environment, liberal causes
- Closest race in history:
 - Florida's 25 electoral votes needed to win presidency
 - <u>Television Networks call the race early</u>...for Gore....
 - As votes counted, lead shifts repeatedly between Gore & Bush
 - At 2:18am, the Networks declare Bush the winner of Florida
 - Florida difference is less then a 1,000 votes
 - ▶ Three Week Recount follows...



 Networks report Gore withdrawing his concession. Automatic recount begins.




Gore concedes to Bush then retracts as national cliffhanger turns on final tally of Florida votes







XXI. Bush v. Gore

- ▶ 5-4 Supreme Court decision ends weeks of Florida recounts.
- Bush officially wins Florida, becomes President
 - ▶ 3rd President to lose the popular vote, but win the Electoral College
- Court rules that the recount is a violation of the 14th Amendment due to there not being a set standard for all ballots to be recounted in Florida.
- Court also ruled that due to the unique circumstances of the case, the reasoning for their ruling can only be used once and doesn't set a precedent for future Supreme Court cases.






Invasion of Iraq, 2003

- ▶ 6,000 Casualties






Al Qaeda in Iraq And Sunni Insurgent Groups December 2006 Al Qaeda in Iraq And Sunni Insurgent Groups June 2008




Nebraska's five electoral votes were split between the two major party tickets; McCain won overall and received four electoral votes, and the Obama ticket won one electoral vote.







Delivering Debt


Through just one term, President Obama is projected to increase publicly held debt by 23.5%—more than that of his predecessor, George Bush, over two terms.




