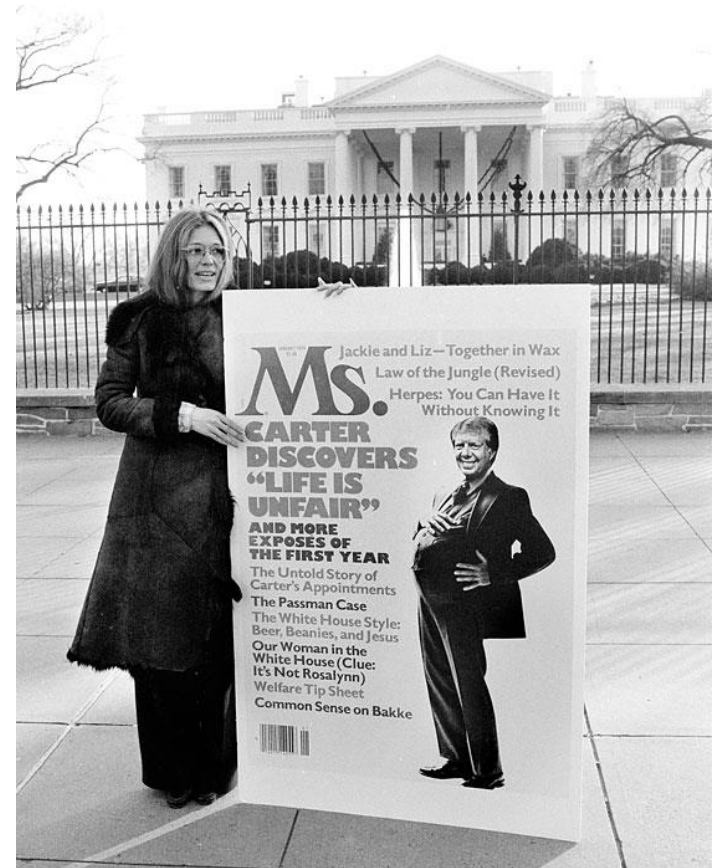
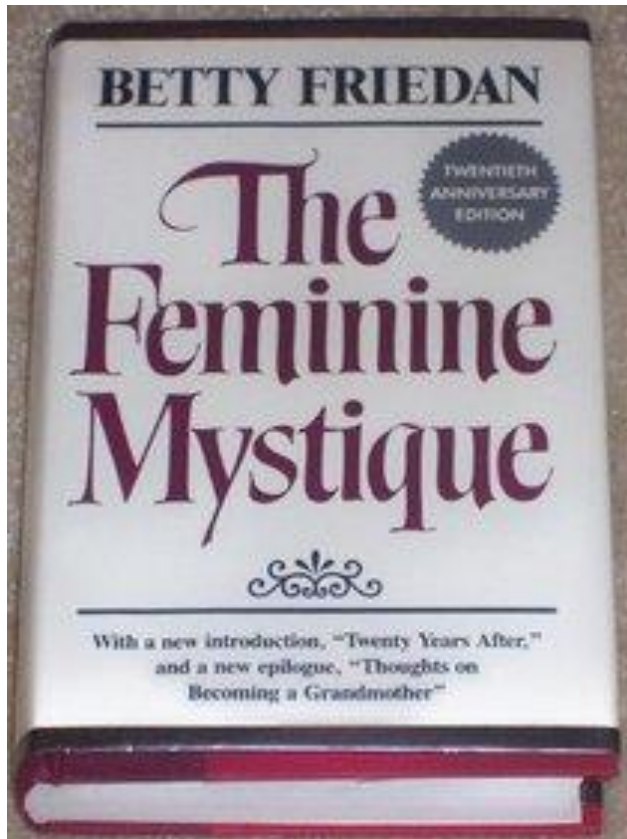

# Yippies and the Hippies

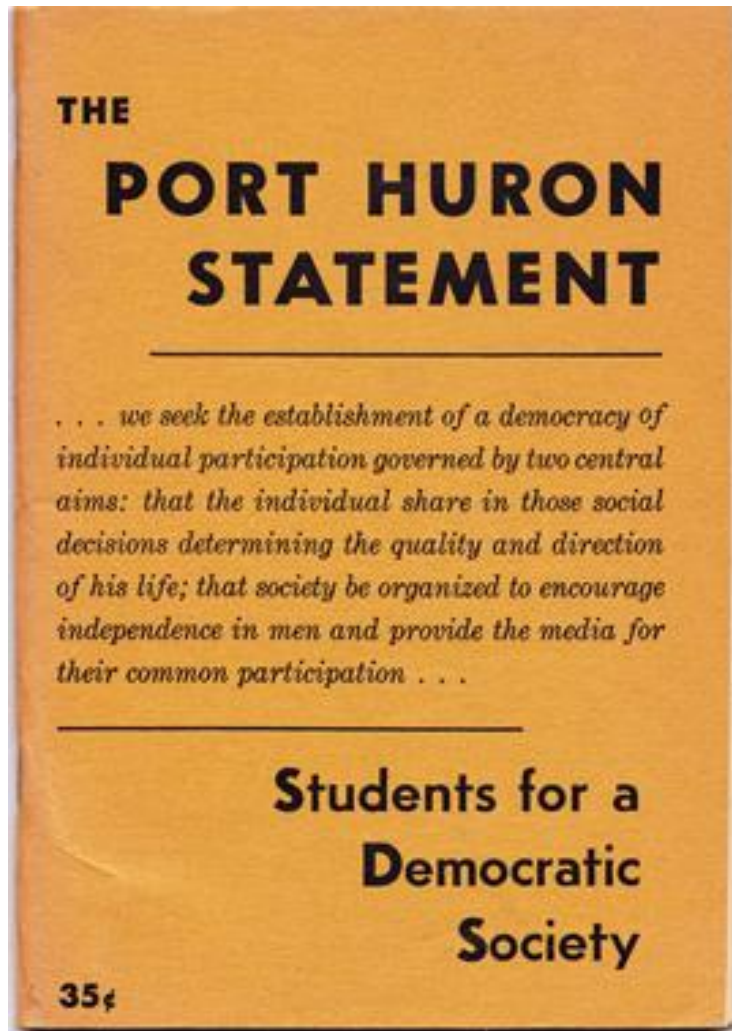
- Yippies
  - Youth International Party
    - Radical Anti-War & Counterrevolutionary Group
- Hippies
  - Youth subculture movement of the '60s
    - Anti- War, Anti-Establishment, Embrace of drug use and the sexual revolution



# New Left

- Liberal, radical Marxist movement of the 1960s
- Merges with the Yippies/Hippies
  - Anti-Establishment
  - Social justice
  - Favored Socialism
  - Anti-War
  - Support unions/labor
  - Institute broad reforms
    - Abortion
    - Gay Rights
    - Drug use

# Port Huron Statement



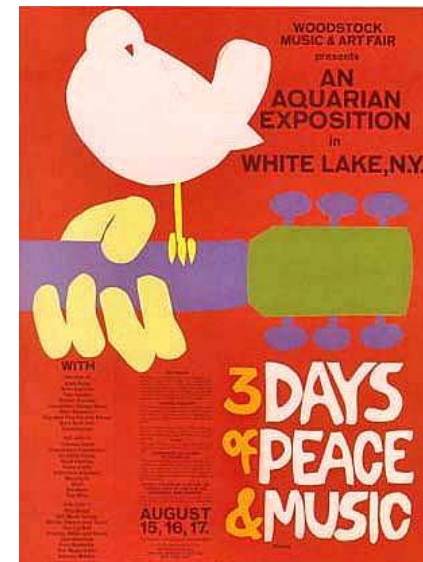
- 1962

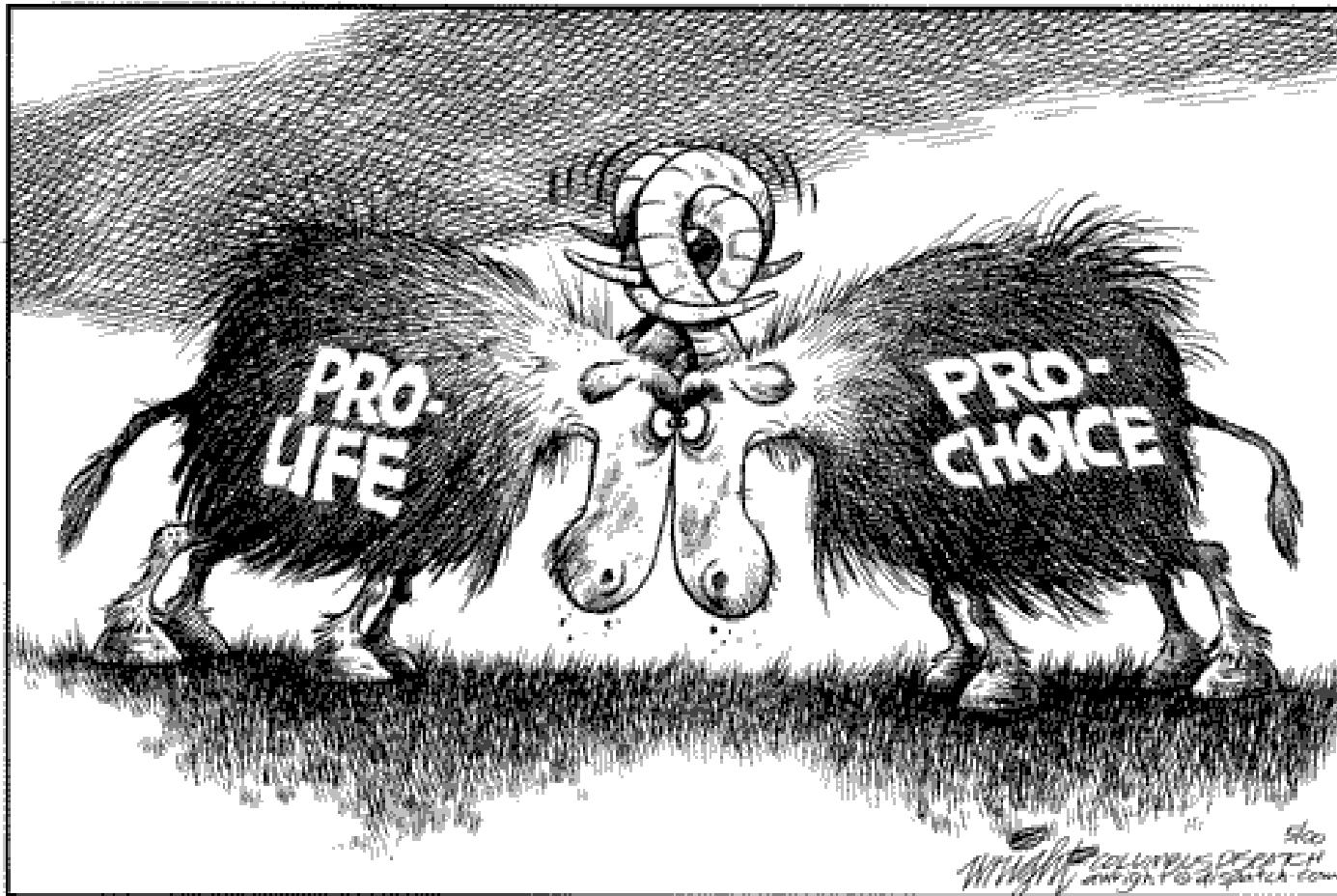

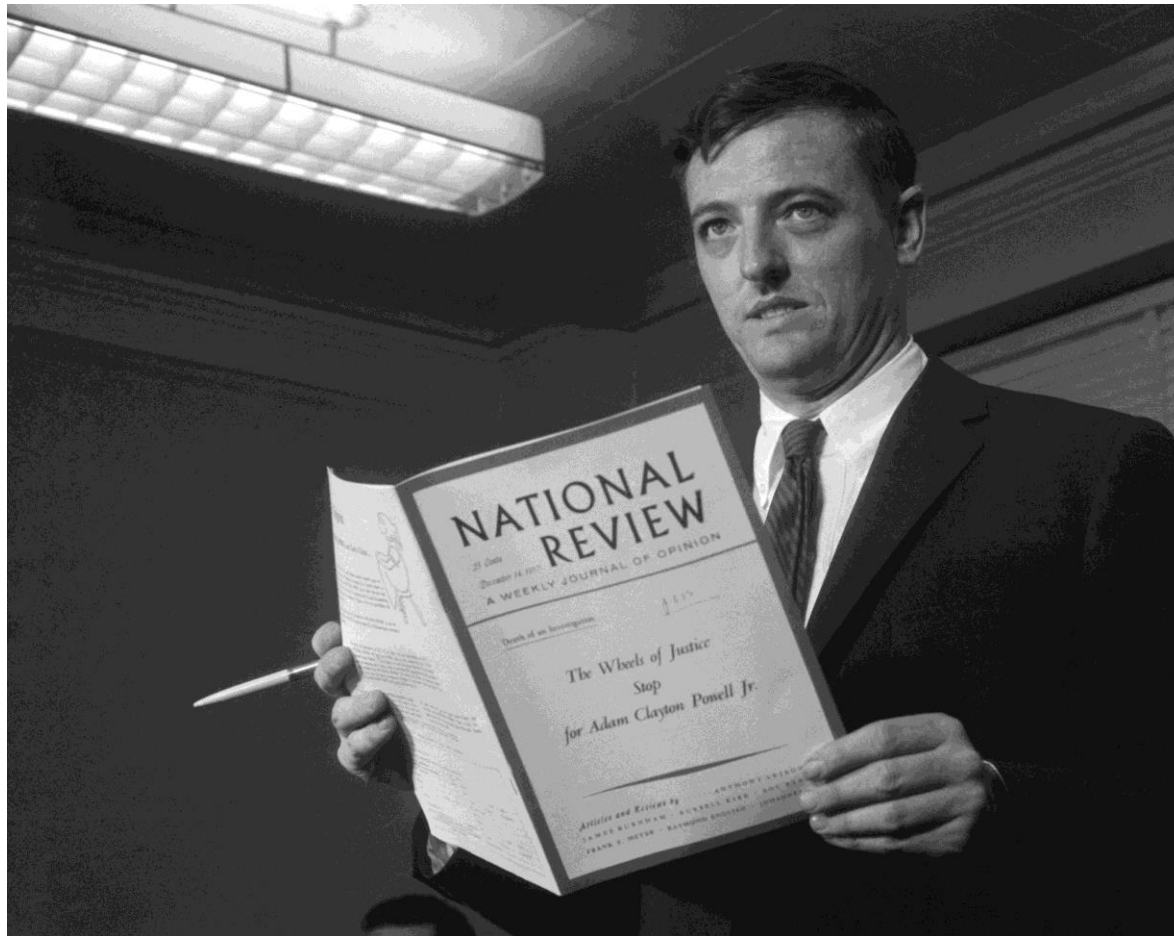
